2. Case study description



- 1. Instead of having a washing machine in each home, there are places where the user can use one of higher quality when needed paying only for the use made.
- 2. The distributor and manufacturer are in charge of the maintenance of the machine and repairmen.

3. The service provider keeps all machines in good conditions and is in charge of offering the best and easiest service for their costumers.

3. Practical examples

Washing machines leasing can adopt different forms adapting to the needs of the consumer, such as:

- Ecolaundry (<u>ecolaundry.es</u>) offers self-service laundry services. It commonly also offer extra services such as soap and dryers. There are conceived as stores where you do the laundry.
- Bundles (<u>bundles.nl</u>) company offer a leasing agreement for washing machines for home.
- There is also an option, which is specially common in countries like Germany that is having a washing machine for the community or the neighborhood. They usually have a machine in a common space and they establish schedules for their use.





4. Results and benefits

By leasing washing machines, the **number of machines** at home, and therefore the **waste** created by their replacement or refurbishment would be reduced. The user would not need to buy one for him/herself and would **not take care of the machines** when damaged or broken; the user would only **pay for the times** or services he/she would totally forget about the maintenance.

Higher quality machines would be offered and the life cycle would be enlarged as the producer and distributor would be in charge of repairing the pieces and refurbishing the machines when necessary. They would be able to recycle pieces and parts of other machines and reduce the waste.

The service provider, who **could be the producer or distributor** themselves, would be in charge of this process and would make sure the machines are in **good conditions to offer the best service**.
